

English Department Portfolio Instructions

Graduating English majors and minors will present a portfolio of selected materials reflecting the student's academic experience within the English Department. English majors cannot be awarded their degree without completing their final portfolio; English minors who do not submit a portfolio cannot be awarded their English minor.

Timeline

Final portfolios are due to the Chair of the Department of English by the end of the eighth week of a student's final semester.

Purpose of the Portfolio

5. Self-Reflection Essay (Majors: 1,000 to 1,500 words; Minors: 750 to 1,000 words)
